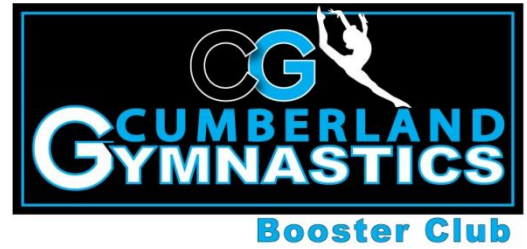


Cumberland Gymnastics Booster Club

Parent Meeting

March 30, 2015



- I. Welcome
 - a. President Report - Nikki Cardin
 - i. Called to order at 6:00.
 - b. Approval of January 2015 Minutes. Moved to Approve: Carmen Segalla
Seconded: Kelli Bender
- II. Melanie's Report
 - a. **Remind 101: text (469) 208-6797 and put @teamcg in the message**
 - b. Summer Schedule – will be out in about two to three weeks (right around the State meet)
 - c. State Meet – April 17, 18, and 19 – We realize everybody has a very busy schedule, but this is a huge fundraiser that defrays many costs. This year we actually projected low because we haven't done this yet, but eventually if we keep up with this it could defray other costs (invitationals, state fees, etc).
 - d. After the State meet we are projecting to have a decent profit, but Melanie will need to know if we want to bid in for next year – but we need the commitment/help. If the families don't want to/can't commit, then we could end up paying more out of pocket.
 - e. Will not be doing conferences at the beginning of the summer (will be at the end(. If you want a conference, please contact Melanie (email) and she will schedule one toward the end of June.

- III. Treasurer's Report
 - a. Budget Report
 - i. Angela Shared the Budget actuals and reviewed some of the items.
 1. Assessments are running ahead of schedule because we had 40% of the families pay early and several families joined after the budget was passed.
 2. Carlisle classic, as a one day meet, we made 8,000 after only having one day.

3. State meet – Expenses will easily exceed 20,000 – but registration is already at 14, 000 income. We are hopeful in projecting about a 15,000 profit.
4. Team fundraisers are on target to meet our goal – which will allow us to have the “Nice to Haves.” The banners that are up for renewal will help us meet our goal.
5. Coaches’ expenses at this point in the year are below projections (we are actually not projected to spend as much as we had budgeted). Melanie was very conscientious about scheduling coaches, plus we had fewer girls in states and regionals.

IV. Vice-President’s Report – Committees

a. Committee Chairs

i. Meet – Co-Chairs Susie Mancuso, Tracie Martin, Kelli Bender

1. Level 6 parents received an email from Melanie, if you have a questions please see one of the Meet committee.
2. Sign-ups will be at 7 pm tomorrow night and the job descriptions will be attached to this email since there are a number of new positions.
3. Parents of gymnasts 12 and under will sign-up for 4 adult slots and two gymnasts slots (12 and under jobs only).
4. Parents of gymnasts 13 and up (level 7 and older) will need to sign-up for three adult slots and three gymnasts slots.
5. Set-up will start at 3 pm on Friday. Entrance will be through the athletic entrance for all attendees.
6. Gymnasts will warm-up in the auxiliary gym (Flight A or Flight B), which means they will warm-up in the aux gym and will compete in the gym.
7. Tracie Martin and Susie Mancuso will be event coordinators.
8. Kelly Rimmer and Gina Harris-Franke will be the volunteer coordinators. There will be no meeting at the start of any session, they will be giving all volunteers a written set of instructions when they check-in.
9. Nora Gulden and Jess Hageman are in charge of concessions.
10. Kelli Bender and Megan Vaughn – will be coordinating awards in the auditorium.
11. Ashley Jones and Larissa Juday will coordinate the auxiliary gym

12. Nikki Cardin and Sarah Navarro are in charge of vendors and candy-grams.
13. Tanya Morret and Tom Martin are in charge of scoring.
14. At this point we DO NOT have report times, but we will not know before sign-ups. So session 1 will be early, Session 2 will be “noonish” or later, and session three may be around 4-5. Girls can qualify up to this past weekend.
15. All gymnasts (and parents, too, if possible) should be wearing Cumberland gear, if siblings are volunteering Cumberland gear would be nice.
